## TEMPORARY NEW RULES FOR RADIUS EDGE POWER SKATING SUMMER MINICAMPS

2021 PHASED IN RULES WILL BE ADAPTED AS THEY HAPPEN

### Current NH guidelines

If you have any COVID-19 symptoms - please stay home

If you have been vaccinated , congratulations !!

### IMPORTANT NOTE FOR MASSACHUSETTS CUSTOMERS:

### How skaters should prepare (and what to expect) for 2021 Radius Edge Power Skating MinCamps:

#### WE HAVE TIGHTENED UP OUR OWN RULES, YOUR SAFETY IS OUR REASON FOR DOING THIS

1. Skaters are not to show up more than 15 minutes prior to their ice time.
  - a. Exception on day 1 of camp, 30 minutes prior.
2. Locker rooms will not be available, skates changing in designated areas only.
3. Equipment bags must be six feet apart when stored in designated areas.
4. Skaters are **encouraged to fully dress at home** but changing in parking lot is typical, proper social distancing must be observed while parking & changing, leave an open space between cars.
5. Locker room usage for this camp is allowed, mask required. No showers for this camp.
6. There will be no dressing except for skates gloves helmet inside the facility and in designated areas only
7. Common areas are closed, thus **no congregating or loitering** in lobby building before or after the program.
8. Skaters should bring their own water bottle with YOUR-NAME on YOUR-BOTTLE.
9. There will be no sharing of water bottles, towels, or any other personal equipment or gear.
10. Skaters are encouraged to carry hand sanitizer in their hockey bag.
11. Thoroughly **sanitize personal gear** and equipment after use.

#### On ice operations and further locker room information:

1. Phase 3 allows for a maximum of 50 % capacity on the ice or roughly 50-60 persons on the ice at a time. We have a cut off for the amount of skaters on the ice, not including instructors and goalies
2. Coaches will be wearing face coverings and carrying hand sanitizer of at least 60% alcohol content
3. Staff equipment and gear must be sanitized before and after use.

4. Some drills may involve direct contact, ie **body-checking or body contact**, masks required under helmets
5. After the session skaters are encouraged to exit the ice using social distance protocols one at a time 6 feet apart, take their skates off, wash/sanitize their hand and then exit the building.

## **Operations inside the rink (for skaters and their families):**

1. All persons will enter and exit the building through authorized doorways, which will be clearly indicated.
2. In order to practice social distancing Skaters, Coaches and Parents will be encouraged to maintain six (6) feet of distance at all times.
3. All persons must wear a face covering at all times, including when entering and leaving the rink.
  - a. The only exception will be Skaters who have been vaccinated, Skaters are required to wear a face covering while skating.
4. Skaters will receive a body temperature scan at check-in, and after will continue to the designated changing area.
5. Parents and players will check in at the registration station daily for daily attendance and daily temperature check.
6. Only the skaters immediate family is allowed inside the rink to watch as long social distance can be maintained.
7. No loitering or socializing in the building before or after program
8. Minors must be attended to and are to observe social distancing to be allowed in the building.
9. Alcohol-based hand sanitizer with at least 60% alcohol content will be readily available to all persons in the building.
10. There will be a dedicated Radius Edge staff member (i.e. safety officer) who will be:
  - a. Clearly designated.
  - b. Responsible for monitoring compliance with all forms of protective actions.
  - c. Responsible for designating an isolation area for anyone who develops symptoms during the session.
  - d. Responsible for taking temperatures and general questioning upon skater arrival.
11. Any mouth-based activity such as spitting and chewing any substance is strictly prohibited.
12. Nose-blowing without tissues is prohibited.

## **Current rules for Skate Lace Tying:**

1. If your skater requires assistance tying skates prior to ice time, staff will not be assisting this year only. Skater or parent will tie their own skates prior to ice time. This is another area where we are adapting to when players are actually engaged in the middle of the program and a lace comes loose and requires some assistance we would then help using the bench area of the rink.
